



## WRCA Mission and Service-Learning Update (June 2023)

Dear WRCA Senior School Families,

We are excited to announce our Mission and Service-Learning Programs for next school year (2023-2024). We've made a few changes, but our hope is to provide both local and global experiences for our students. For many years, WRCA has supported Mission and Service Learning (MSL) throughout the school community and beyond into the world. The school mission statement and the school values have guided our actions toward MSL; however, we feel it is time to formalize a delivery model for MSL that incorporates what has been done in the past and provides a framework for the future.



MSL means more than going somewhere or doing something. Mission is about being God's people with a salvation message that is both heard and seen. In Christ we inherited Abraham's blessing and his mission to go and be a blessing. This is who we are and what we are here for—to participate in God's promised mission of bringing people from all nations into the experience of God's redemptive blessing through Christ. This requires of us Christian faith, a holy life, a compassionate heart, sacrificial commitment, and caring generosity. We must therefore **teach** our students to **know** the Gospel of God, **pray** that they will **live** the Gospel, **provide** opportunities to **proclaim** the Gospel and equip and send them as **servants** of our Servant God.

This foundation underpins our understanding of MSL and enables consistent, sequential, age-appropriate Mission and Service opportunities from K-12. The following information will focus on MSL experiences for students in the Senior School. Please note that safety will continue to be our top priority in planning for these trips.

This document is intended to help for planning purposes only. With all these things in mind, we are looking at the following MSL experiences for the 2023-2024 school year:

- Grade 6-8 MSL **Community Projects** in the local South Surrey community— Term 1 and 2 (all students)
  - As part of the Bible 6-8 courses
- Grade 9- **First Nations** MSL experience in Duncan and Chemainus – **May 2024** (optional by application)
  - Info session- Fall 2023
- Grade 10- Global: **Japan- May 2024** - (optional by application)
  - Info session- Fall 2023
- Grade 11- Global: **Indonesia- March 2024** (optional by application)
  - Info session- Fall 2023

Please note that there will be separate mandatory meetings in the fall for each of the respective Grade 9, 10 and 11 MSL experiences for the 2023-2024 school year to go over the trip logistics and details.

**Applications for global trips will be made available in September.**

Please note: Effective September 1, 2023, WRCA will now classify MSL programs fees charged in the senior school as additional tuition. This reclassification will allow these charges to be added to WRCA's basic tuition charge when we calculate the tuition donation receipt every February.

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### **Rationale:**

In alignment with providing holistic education from a Biblical Christian worldview, students will develop a Biblical theology of missions and service in order to become more active and reflective participants in God’s redemptive work. MSL experiences will promote a greater understanding of one’s place in the world and the gifts that God has given to serve others. In addition, MSL trips are to be comprised of the following: (a) relevance to curricular connections, (b) participation, reflection, and faith formation, (c) exploration of individual giftings, (d) intercultural understanding, (e) community building or partnering with organizations to develop projects and initiatives, and (f) some sort of stretching or purposeful discomfort in a local to global context.

Grade 6 MSL Student Projects	Students in Grades 6-8 investigate and serve with local (South Surrey) organizations during terms one and two. We also attend mission’s fest, participate in a group service project to learn from a local Christian organization, and the students reflect on how what they are learning in their Bible class can help them to develop as citizens of Godly character who transform their world for Christ by becoming better learners. Students share their reflections and experiences at the G6-8 MSL exhibition.
